

Camp Kee Tov 2023 Health and Safety Policy



1. COVID-19 Vaccinations

For the 2023 Camp Kee Tov season, all eligible Staff and Campers are required to be up-to-date with the COVID-19 vaccine. You are considered up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines when you have received all doses in the primary series and all boosters recommended for you, when eligible.

Exceptions to this policy for campers with a doctor's note will be made on a case-by-case basis.

2. Masking

Masking is required while on buses, indoors at Beth El, or where it is determined by staff that adults and children will be in a space that is not conducive to social distancing for a prolonged period of time. All campers and staff will be expected to follow these rules and a failure to do so may result in not being allowed to be at Camp.

3. Testing Positive for COVID-19

What do I do if my child tests positive for COVID-19?

- Stay home: your child must quarantine for at least 5 days regardless of vaccination status.
- IF after day 5, your child is fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing

medication and their other symptoms have improved, they may return to Camp Kee Tov. Your child must wear a well-fitting mask during all camp activities until 10 full days after testing positive.

- IF your child continues to have symptoms, they must stay home and can end quarantine after 10 days.

Please report all test results to the Camp Kee Tov office as soon as they are ready.

4. Close contacts

If your child is a close contact of someone who tested positive for COVID-19:

- IF the Camper does not show any symptoms, campers may return to Kee Tov but must wear a well-fitted mask and be tested 5 days after the exposure with either an antigen or PCR test. Test results must be reported to the Camp Kee Tov office as soon as they are ready.
- IF at any point the Kee Tov camper exhibits symptoms, the camper must stay home and follow procedures outlined above.

5. Testing

Camp Kee Tov Staff are all vaccinated and boosted. Tests are provided to the staff weekly for them to administer at home on Sunday before work.

Campers are required to test and submit results prior to attending a Camp overnight.

If at any point a family needs a test, Camp Kee Tov will happily provide it for that family/child.

As always, if conditions change, these guidelines may change based on local health orders and/or other guidance with decisions made by the Camp Kee Tov Director, Beth EI Executive Director, and Beth EI Board Leadership.
